

Pinnguaq to require double vaccination for all upcoming Iqaluit Makerspace workshops

January 20, 2022 (Iqaluit, Nunavut) - Ensuring the health and safety of our learners, Pinnguaq Association will require all staff and participants attending programs starting next week at the Pinnguaq Iqaluit Makerspace to provide proof of their double vaccination.

“A safe environment is one in which we can all learn and engage together,” says Ben Westwell, Iqaluit Delivery Lead for Pinnguaq. “That’s why we’re asking our participants to help ensure their safety, as well as the safety of those around them. As well, the Pinnguaq team is leading by example and have all been fully vaccinated.”

This policy will apply to all employees, learners, contractors, and volunteers entering the Makerspace until further notice.
